Background

Harmful use of alcohol is a risk factor for over 200 diseases and injuries,

- It also inflicts significant socioeconomic impacts on individuals, households and society,
- Consumption of alcohol in India is estimated at 4.3L per capita per year¹; about 50% from unrecorded alcohol,

Objectives

Determine the costs associated with alcohol use in India through desk review and focus-group discussions with key stakeholders in 2016

Methods


- Four key dimensions studied:
 - Healthcare, productivity loss, crime and law enforcement, road traffic injuries²; and opportunity cost due to expenditure on alcohol
- Desk review, in-depth discussions with secondary stakeholders
- Costs calculated at national level and three state (Karnataka, Punjab and Delhi)

Results

For every **US\$1** that is **gained** from alcohol, **US\$2.35** is **lost**

The intangible impacts on the like emotional distress in households not captured in this study

Conclusions

There is inadequate data on the socio-economic costs associated with alcohol in India. Available data suggest a net economic loss due to alcohol, as opposed to industry's claims of revenue and employment generation.
